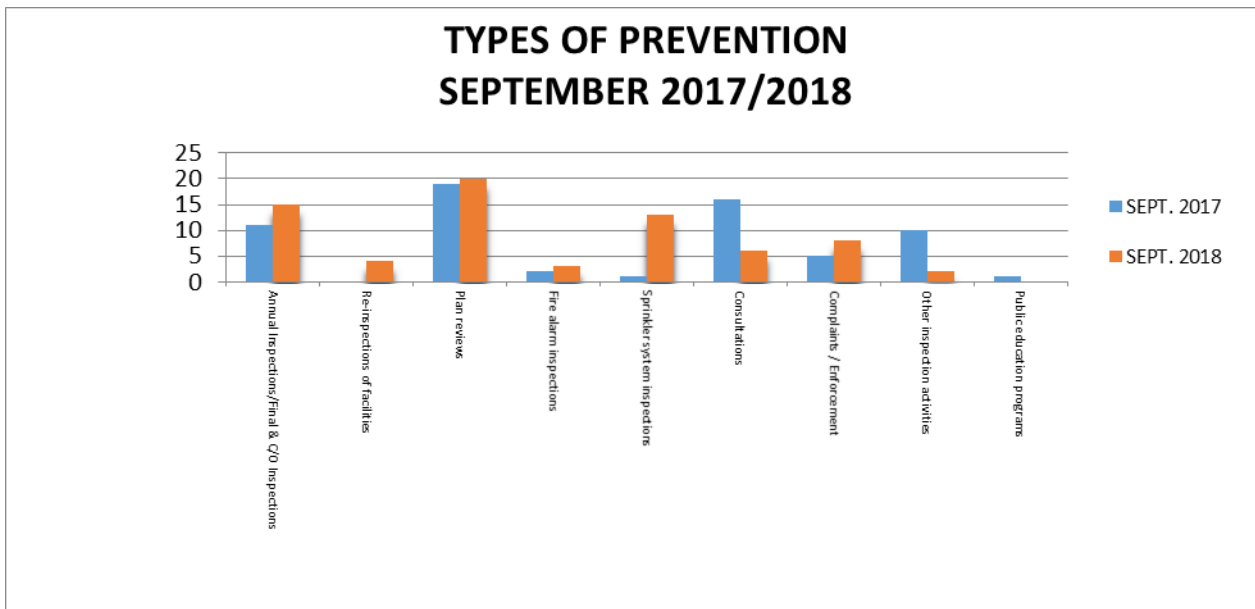


FIRE PREVENTION DEPARTMENT UPDATE

WFD – Special Operations Report - September 2018

Dive Team: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell

Dive Response:

1. Webster Special Operations Unit received no requests for response during September 2018.

Dive Training:

1. New equipment components incorporated into new and existing gear (new navigational aids for zero visibility water conditions).
2. Upcoming training:
 - On Friday, October 26, 2018: Webster Dive Team members to perform timed-training evolutions at the San Jacinto Maritime Academy swimming pool. New training aids and a new navigational aid will be incorporated in routine exercises designed to increase safety, efficiency and capability of the dive team.
 - Coordinating instruction for PADI Tender certification training (surface support) to current roster and other WFD/WPD members interested in performing that particular function. This training will likely occur between October and November 2018 (conditional on instructor availability).
 - Continued re-organization of the dive trailer. Planning for new storage racks and general layout of the trailer to increase readiness and efficiency for deployment.

Rescue Boat: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell

Rescue Boat Response:

1. No rescue boat responses during September 2018. Rescue Boat-14 is reported as working properly and ready for response.

Rescue Boat Training:

1. On Thursday, September 20 – Friday, September 21, 2018, from 08:00 hrs. – 17:00 hrs.: Four (4) WFD members attended Flood Rescue Boat Operator class with Rescue Boat-14 in the Clear Lake and Taylor Lake waters. Instruction by Rescue Training International and coordinated by Harris County, Texas. This 2-day, hands-on training provided 3-year certification for the



following members: FM Dean Spencer, FPS-Lt. Kevin Dozier, Lt. Marshall Boyd, and FF Orlando Zepeda.

Meeting:

1. No formal meetings were conducted during September 2018, only informal discussions concerning status and readiness.

Car Seats: Report submitted by S. Ricicar

1. The WFD CPS technicians assisted with one (1) car-seat installation during September 2018. Car-seat installations are handled as needed at the fire station, and through participation at special events held at the fire station and outside venues.

Wildland: Report submitted by Shift Commander J. Myers

Wildland Training:

1. Eight (8) WFD members enrolled in a free, online wildland weather class (S-290).
