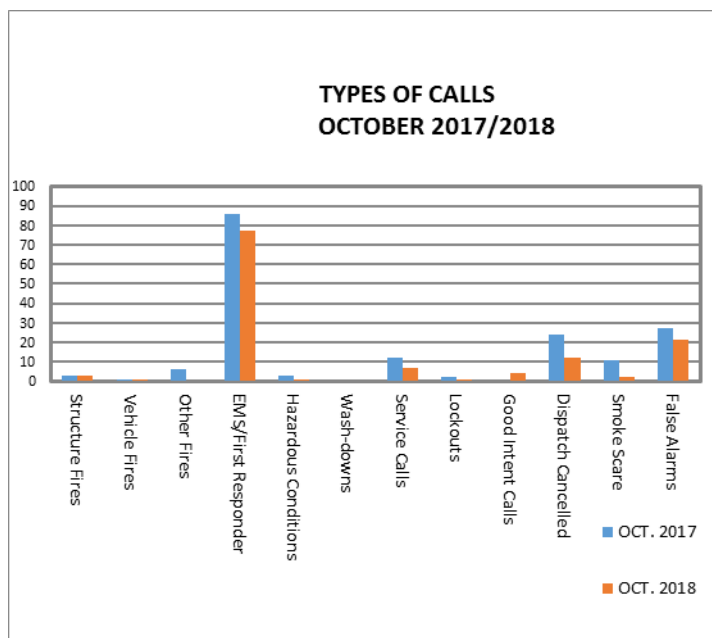

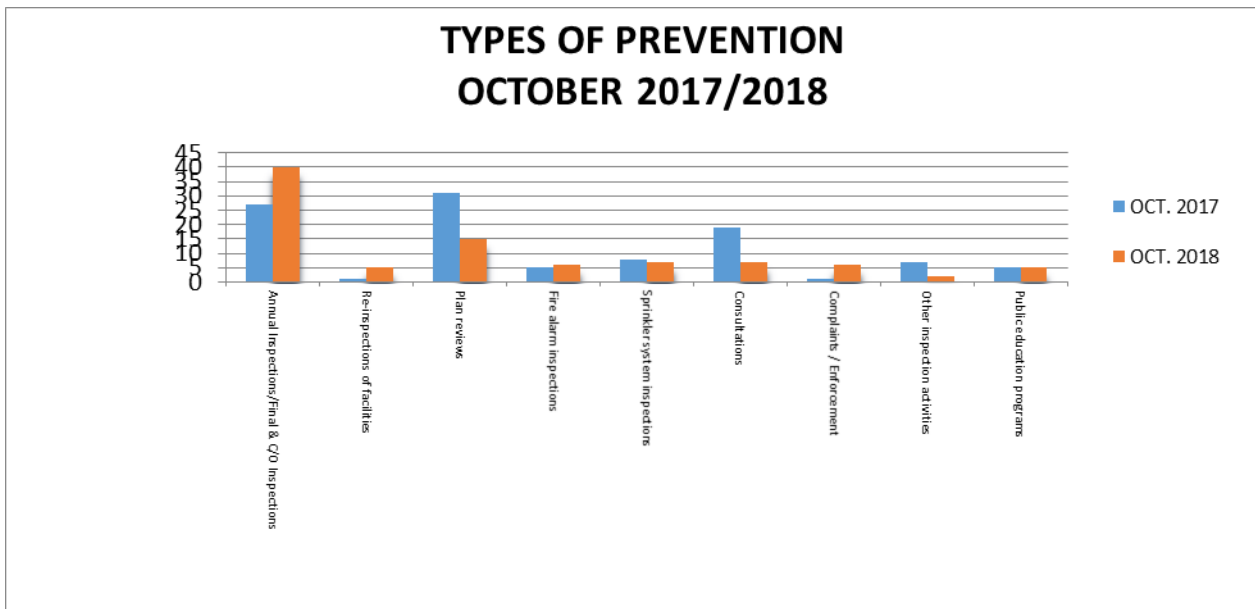


## FIRE PREVENTION DEPARTMENT UPDATE

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## WFD – Special Operations Report - October 2018

### **Dive Team: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell**

#### Dive Response:

1. Webster Special Operations Unit received no requests for response during October 2018.

#### Dive Training:

1. Manipulative Training:
  - On Friday, October 26, 2018: Webster Dive Team members performed timed training evolutions at the San Jacinto Maritime Academy swimming pool.
    - Response time to location was 21 minutes (on target).
    - Donning full gear ready to enter the water within ten (10) minutes (on target).
    - Established primary, back-up and 90 percent (90%) diver positions for planned evolutions.
    - New navigational aid was utilized, and it proved to be accurate and useful for limited/zero visibility.
    - Divers refined buoyancy skills, victim recovery strategies, and improved communication skills from diver-to-diver and diver-to-surface.
    - Logs were completed, gear cleaned, and/or repaired, as needed.
  - Utilized “Murray” the underwater recovery victim for the first time. Proved to be a challenge for a single diver to recover from the bottom. The two-diver recovery of “Murray” was faster and safer for divers.
  - Lt.-FPS K. Dozier attended as the team’s first experience with a dedicated Tender (surface support) to aid divers, conduct safety checks, and communicate with each diver. This uncovered a true need for additional team members as the minimum necessary for a response is five (5) people to be a safe, effective team.
  - Debrief of the training dive occurred on Wednesday, October 31, 2018. Discussion concerned the successes of each training evolution and skills covered, along with additional equipment needs of divers and tenders.
2. Upcoming training:
  - Continued coordinating instruction for PADI Tender certification training (surface support) through Texas Dive Center for current roster and other WFD/WPD members interested in performing that particular function. This training is being planned for completion before the end of 2018 (conditional on staff and instructor availability).
  - Continued re-organization of the dive trailer. Planning for new storage racks and general layout of the trailer to increase readiness and efficiency for deployment.



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**Rescue Boat: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell**

**Rescue Boat Response:**

1. No rescue boat responses during October 2018.
2. Rescue Boat-14 is reported as working properly and ready for response.
3. The new rescue boat is still under construction at this time.
